3.3	Other Matters Arising: DBS Checks for staff and volunteer staff - Previously Governors were informed that any staff not in school for 3 months or more would not trigger the need for a new DBS check if the reason they were not in was Covid related. Now that staff are back in school we are back to the default position that if a member of staff is not in for 3 months they will need to renew their DBS check. All volunteers and casual staff will need to come to the school in person to avoid a 3 month gap. If that is not possible a new check will need to be done with payment being decided at the time. It was decided that it would be fine for staff to come into reception and sign in briefly without having to come into the school. HT These members of staff will also need the latest copy of the RA and KCSinE. All agreed on this ACTION.		
4.	Updates for Governors incl. reports		
4.1	SEF and AIP update from HT - Governors to ask questions on these documents. IS Some of these items follow in from		
	Standards and Curriculum meeting. Since then it has been noted that exams will be delayed for 3 weeks. HT This gives

students 75 extra hours of education, although staff workload will increase and this could cause some issues. We have			
discussed offering time back in the summer however we have £17,000 of catch up funding coming in and the suggestion is			
that reading should be the focus in KS3 with small group work in KS4. Period 6 is offering a lot of students input and with th	9		
money we have we can pay a base rate to our staff and reimburse them for the time they are offering so that we can keep			
teaching within the academic year. IS Re QA in the SEF and maintaining this, any comments? HT The most difficult things			
are book scrutiny due to Covid restrictions, and having to quarantine books. We are thinking that we would get staff or			
students to leave their books open on their desk for staff to look at. Maths dept are trialling an online marking system for the			
top sets in KS4 and 5. This comes with issues such as training for staff in its use. We have had two training days for staff the			
term and since that we have gone to remote meetings. This has been successful due to the dedication of staff. IS Sharp			
starts to lessons, any comments on this? HT these are a challenge for KS3 teachers as they are moving round, but student	,		
are becoming used to the protocol now. JT has made sure that the majority of lessons for KS4 students are in the same roo			
for the same subject. We are making changes that we think will develop the curriculum further. We are looking at moving			
certain year groups around which should aid KS3 students going forward. <i>IS Attendance in year 11, has there been any</i>			
improvement on this? HT this is a concern, it is currently at around 93.1% which is in line with Devon. We are currently about	re l		
national average due to Covid-19 but we want to be able to hold this figure. We are only one term in and a small number of			
students can have a big impact on figures in a short space of time. IS Is period 6 still going well? HT This has been			
successful, we have had 65-75 students accessing this every day after school. We are having good feedback from students			
and parents that are accessing the videos at home. All of our options subjects are keen to support their students and after			
half term we will be offering core and options in these extra lessons and will eventually be adding PCRE into this. When we			
get closer to exams in March we will offer transport once a week for those students in Lynton and Combe Martin that strugg	۵		
to get to P6. In academic year 21-22 if we can find £17,000 in the budget, we can offer P6 every year as we know that			
independent learning is one of the major drivers for our students. DG Do we have a way of monitoring which students are			
taking part at home and is this being followed up? HT We have had confirmation from students and parents that students are			
accessing it. We are setting up a Microsoft forms sheet for students to access during tutor time to confirm that they have	5		
accessed it and to give any feedback they have. As videos are held within the cloud, we are looking to see if there is a way	of

5.	Reporting & Monitoring – Main Focus, Portfolio Reports and Questions		
5.1	Standards and Curriculum portfolio report: IS noted that his name is not on the notes despite his attendance. Clerk to amend ACTION. RA noted that it is a positive that the full curriculum apart from food tech has been given to children since September. The Curriculum statement has been updated and shared and this will then go onto SLT and Governors before going on the website. Approx 60-70 students each night are turning up for period 6. HT confirmed that this is an accurate representation. RA noted that the school has written a bid to the county to apply for funding for an ASD and SEMH centre. HT We know there is a considerable need for our community as we have high levels of SEMH students and high levels of ASD students. We have applied to have a centre in our school for these students that would allow us to continue with the work we have already at Killacleave. We believe we have a good chance of being successful in this bid. HT noted that he would like to apply for a pre school ?? Is this correct? for the Killacleave site that would cater for ASD, behavioural and vocational facility. RA noted that a staff, student and parent survey had been conducted and the results of these have been positive. HT The results of these along with the HSE visit, which went very wel,I have been put out to parents.	AH Clerk	22/11
5.2	SIAMS Ethos and Community portfolio report: The school are trying to keep as many links as possible open during the Covid situation, we have many links with the community through the food bank and other various contacts. We have also made contact with an admin from the Gossip Around Ilfracombe Facebook group to mitigate any rumours that may arise and this is not just about the parents but reassuring the community too. It has been noted that there is approx. 88% parent engagement with Weduc (target 95%).	JG	
5.3	SEND and Safeguarding portfolio report: JG noted that all the results are going in the right direction, SEND pupils have been impacted by the lockdown more than any other group. The interventions that usually take place with SEN students cannot happen currently. Killacleave is still running but at reduced numbers. The introduction of Edukey for SEND pupils has been good with this logging all aspects of the pupil for staff to access in one place. RA provision mapping for the SEND has a task force set up to deal with this.	JG
